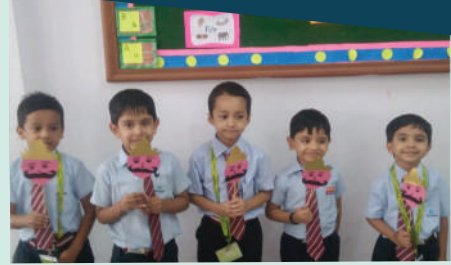

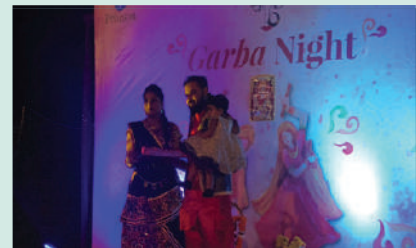
GARBA CELEBRATION
