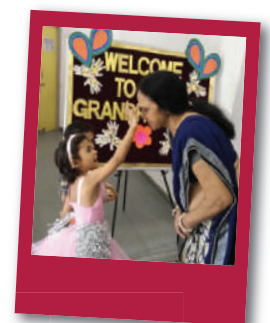
Earthquake Drills and exercises are an extremely important part especially when you live in one of the seismic zones prone to frequent earthquakes. These drills teach students, staff as well as parents how to respond to the complications of an actual earthquake. At the same time it helps us evaluate how well all parameters of our emergency plan work together and how well trained we are.

An earthquake drill was conducted on 16th September 2017. It began when the emergency alarm rang, the students were guided by the teachers to DUCK, COVER and HOLD'-protect and cover their head and body if no cover is available. As soon as the alarm stopped the students and staff immediately started evacuating the building and reached the designated place i.e. the Assembly Area. Once all had assembled, a head count of all the students was done followed by a briefing by the Principal.

GENERAL KNOWLEDGE AND ENGLISH OLYMPIAD - The aim of conducting Olympiads is to provide a unique competitive platform and identify the young geniuses and create a talent pool for the future. They are not just exams, but they do a lot more to bring out the best in a child. It motivates students to strive for better as well as develops a sense of confidence in them. Olympiads being tricky and more conceptual, help students understand the topic well, which thereby improves class results.

In order to inculcate the habit of taking challenges ,testing their understanding, level of knowledge and power of reasoning the students participated in the G.K. Olympiad (25th September 2017) and English Olympiad (6th October 2017) –wherein the students from Grade I-IX were provided a platform to showcase conceptual clarity at a national level.
