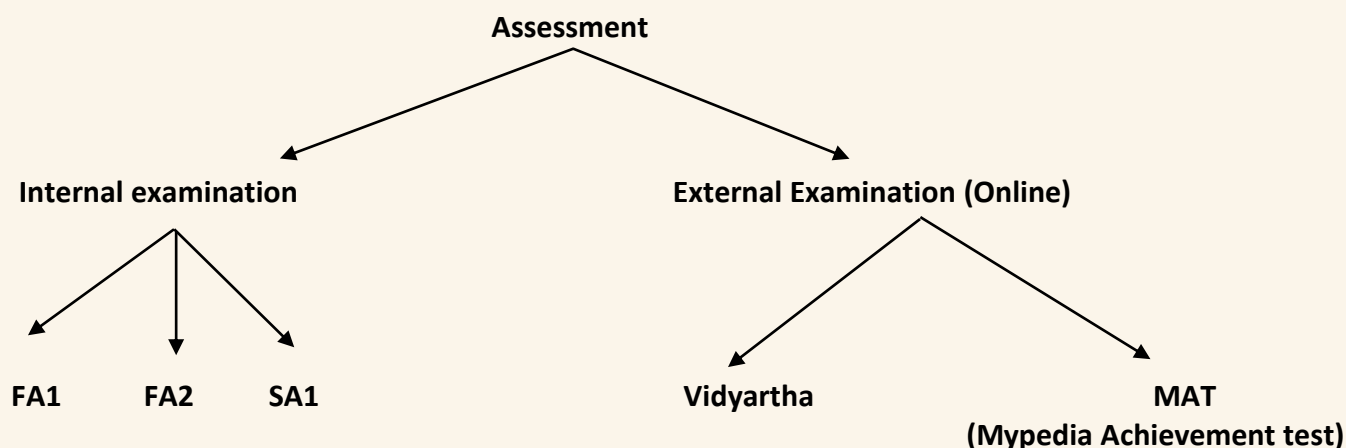
Yard Stick
