ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES

FIELD TRIP GRADE VI-VIII

LIBRARY ACTIVITY

Magical journey to the ancient world (Panchatantra stories)

A child's reading skills are important for success in school as it will allow him to access the breadth of the curriculum and improve communication and language skills. In addition to this, reading can be a fun and imaginative time for children, which opens doors to all kinds of new worlds for him. However, it is noticed at times that children do not enjoy reading. But books of Panchatantra lure children to read.

As we all know Panchatantra is a collection of fables written in Sanskrit. It is one of the most popular collections of stories from the ancient India civilization. The tales, most of which are based on animals, come with a strong moral message. Panchatantra stories for kids have a strong plot with different characters, making them interesting. The students of grades I and II were briefed about the "PANCHATANTRA" story which was conducted on 6th Sept, 2019. The children thoroughly enjoyed the interesting stories of Panchatantra, the visuals added to their interest.



INNOVATION LAB

Motor boat - Students of grade III made the model of a motor boat. They were introduced to various means of transport, and into how many types of boats can be classified etc. They also came to know about the various motions produced by the motor boat.

Relay control mechanism - Relay control mechanism activity was taken up for grade III which introduced the functioning of relays. A relay is a kind of switching device that has 5 pins. Two are coil pin, one is common, one is normally closed and the other is normally open. Students made LED based relay control mechanism, controlling the operation of 2 LEDs simply by triggering one of the pins of the relay.

Vacuum cleaner - Students of grade V made the model of a vacuum cleaner. They first understood the meaning of vacuum. The vacuum cleaner works on the principle of pressure difference. They used motor, propeller, plastic boxes to make the vacuum cleaner. They also used various mechanic devices like wire strippers, glue guns, cutter to increase their hands-on skills on various innovation sessions.





Crane making - Students of grade VI made the model of a crane. They understood the working of a lever in this activity and the various parts of the lever i.e. payload, efforts and fulcrum. They also classified three parts of the lever based on the position of fulcrum which are class 1 lever, class 2 lever, and class 3 lever.

Hydraulic Lift - Students of grades VII and VIII made the model of a hydraulic lift that is used to lift heavy objects using the application of hydraulics. Through this activity, students were introduced to the very important - Pascal's law, and the relation between pressure and volume at a constant temperature.

VACCINATION DRIVE

India, along with ten other WHO South East Asia Region member countries, has resolved to eliminate measles and control rubella/congenital rubella syndrome (CRS) by 2020.

In this direction, the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare has initiated the measles-rubella (MR) vaccination cam-

paign in the age group of 9 months to less than 15 years in a phased manner across the nation. The campaign aims to cover approximately 41 crore children.

The Measles-Rubella campaign is a part of global efforts to reduce illness and deaths due to measles and rubella/CRS in the country. Measles immunization directly contributes to the reduction of under-five child mortality, and in combination with rubella vaccine, it will control rubella and prevent CRS.

Pearson School Jaipur joined hands with the Health Department of Rajasthan. We are happy to announce that on the 12th of September 2019 the vaccinations were given to 308 children successfully in the school
