ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES

FIELD TRIP TO SUPERMARKET

Real life experiences add to classroom learning. Our little learners of KG 1 and KG 2 were taken to a supermarket on 28th and 29th of August to give them an overview of day to day items and essentials.

MATCHING OBJECTS TO LETTERS - 24TH SEPTEMBER 2019

Objective: To recognize the lower case/ upper case letters and match to the respective object.

Students of KG 1 were provided with concrete objects available in the class and letter cards. They were asked to pick up any object of their choice and pick up the letter card it begins with. Children could match the object with the respective letter card. Few children sought support which was provided by the teachers. It was a fruitful activity and the children enjoyed learning in a play way method.



LEARNING THE SHAPE CIRCLE - 25TH SEPTEMBER 2019

Objective: To identify circular objects and learn the concept of circle.



The students were taught the concept of the shape-circle. Circle shaped objects were shown to the learners. Later they were asked to identify the circular objects present in the classroom. Students were engaged in a sparkle colour activity.
