ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES

NATURE WALK

Objective: Students to learn about plants, its different parts and food required by plants.

Students of KG 2 were taken to the school's garden for a nature walk. They were shown different types of plants and trees. Students touched and felt various parts of plants and this made their learning concrete. The teacher showed each part of the plant and explained it. To reflect on their day's learning and consolidate it, the students drew the picture of a plant which they had observed.

Objective: To recognize and identify yellow colour.

Green is the grass, string beans and peas. Green are the leaves on the trees.



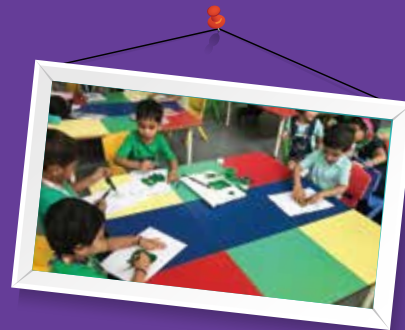

Objective: Identifying and matching colours and developing fine motor skills.

Nursery students had fun with red and yellow colour triangles on 5th Aug 19. The triangles were so chosen, to help the learners identify the colours and distinguish between them. Another objective achieved through this activity is the development of fine motor skills in the students. It was indeed a great learning and fun time for the kids and their teachers.

To make the learners understand the process of seed growing into a plant, students of KG2 were involved in experiential learning. They sowed seeds on 7th Aug 19 and after few days, those seeds grew into seedling thus forming a plant. Students were excited during the period and excitedly observed the transformation of a seed into a seedling. They learnt about 4 friends of farmers which help the seeds to grow, namely air, water, soil and sunlight. Students were able to demonstrate the knowledge about how seeds grow. Students recited the rhyme with teacher with full enthusiasm.

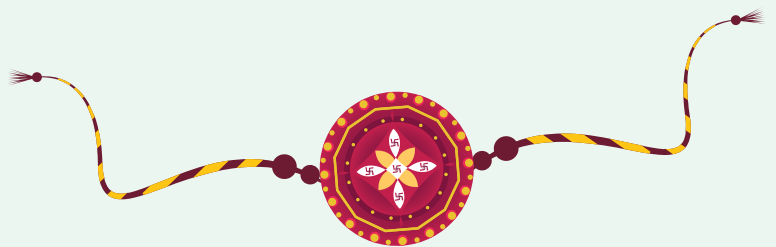
NUMBER 10

They were then asked to put their hand impressions on a sheet of paper and finally they numbered the finger impressions sequentially from 1 to 10. The faces of children lit with the joy of learning while having fun. Involving their senses in counting ensured their learning to be permanent and helped develop a connect with their subject.

RAKSHA BANDHAN CELEBRATION

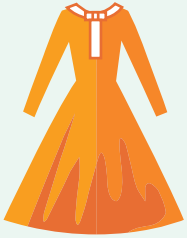

ORANGE DAY



To acquaint the little ones with the concept of this secondary colour and objects related to it, the children and their teachers, dressed in Orange colour on 16th Aug 2019.

Students brought orange coloured objects with them and shared few words about the same. It was followed by clay activity, where, KG2 children made cut-outs of carrots and leaves on it. KG1 children made orange fruits and beautified them with natural leaves Nursery children did cotton painting using orange colour on cut outs of carrot, orange and ice cream. Children had a fun filled Orange day.

COTTON PAINTING

Objective: To enhance the fine motor skills of learner using different colours and develop mobility skills.

On 16th Aug 2019 students of KG1 were given cotton which they used with different water colours for stamping on a pineapple. They expressed themselves without the use of words, Children were excited to see the various effects on paper due to cotton impressions and learnt the use of right amount of pressure to create perfect impressions.



TEARING AND PASTING

Objective: To develop pre-writing skills, enhance gripping and develop fine-motor skills.

Tearing paper into small pieces can be fun and satisfying. This activity encourages useful finger co-ordination skills. An activity of tearing paper was conducted in KG 1 on 21st Aug 2019 in which toddlers learnt to hold the paper between the thumb and pointing finger of each hand, which develops muscles of their hands and fingers, thereby, preparing the child for writing.

Children were given red coloured glaze paper, which they tore into pieces, and picked the pieces and pasted them one after the other on the picture of an apple using glue stick. It was a fun filled activity. Children enjoyed colouring the apple with torn pieces of red coloured paper.





JANMASHTAMI CELEBRATION

Objective: To make the learners aware about the importance of Janmashtami festival and to acquaint them about the mythological story of Lord Krishna.



Festivals are a great way to teach little ones about the vibrant culture and traditions of our country. Making them part of the celebrations, makes them curious to learn more and it also teaches them the importance of offering a helping hand. Our festivals celebrate a sense of community with every member doing his or her bit, so why not allow our little ones to experience the same joy of being a part of the festivities and contribute in their own little way.

Children of pre-primary dressed themselves as Radha and Krishna on 23rd Aug 2019 for Janmashtami celebration. They brought props with them like flute and morpankhs; Radhas had put on Mehandi (Heena) on their hands which they displayed in the photo session done in class. Teachers of pre-primary dressed themselves as mythological characters and presented a small skit depicting the story of Krishna. The enchanting story mesmerised the little ones.

A symbolic matki phod had also been organised.

The celebrations culminated with joyful dancing by students and teachers.

OPEN HOUSE

Objective: Development of gross motor skills in the beginners.

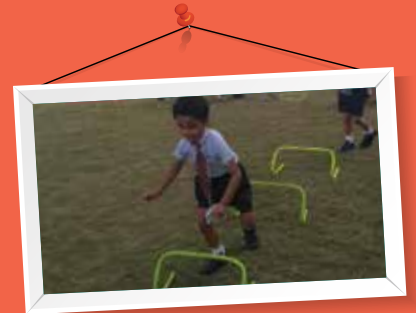
