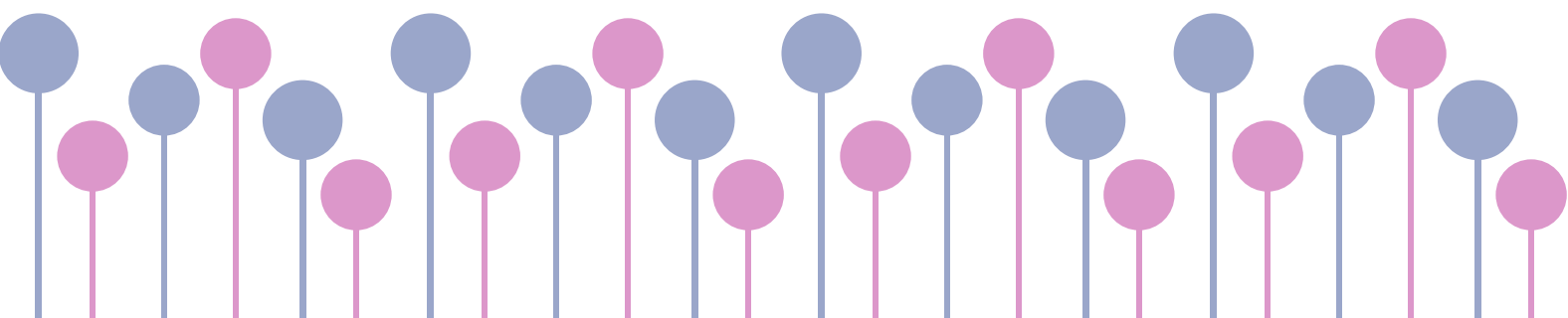

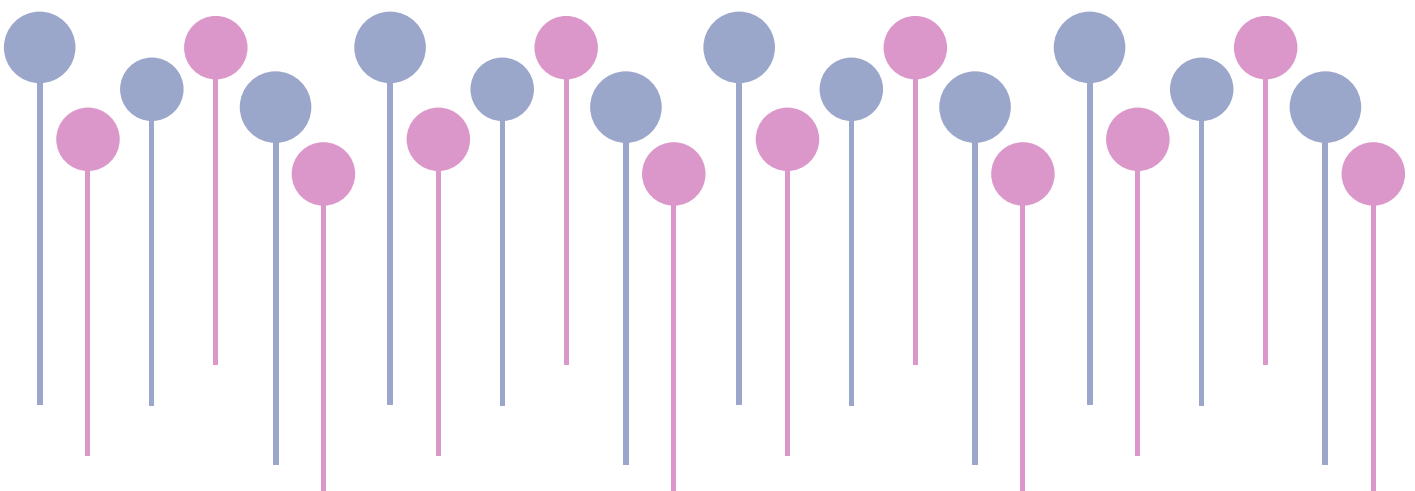
Creativity with Guidance

ACTIVITIES

First Day of the School

A Joyous Beginning: The first day of these little ones was filled with warmth and excitement.

Children explored their classroom with guidance from caring teachers. Group activities were conducted like Pass the ball to help foster friendships and also to develop their motor skills. Simple routines were introduced to provide structure. To make them comfortable and enjoy their first day, teachers planned various activities like scribbling, different games with the colourful balls, tearing and pasting etc.

Throughout the day, teachers focused on building strong relationships with each child, laying the foundation for a year of growth and learning.

Number Hunt - PP-I

Learning numbers in a fun way is important for building the basic concepts of Mathematics.

In the number hunt activity our Ryanites looked and observed the written numbers on the board and hunted and found a specific number and pointed them using the paper hand.

After completing this number hunt activity, children were more familiar with different representations of numbers. This is an important math skill which will benefit them throughout their education.

Number hunt activity builds number recognition and also hones a child's powers of observation.

Pom Pom Pick-Up Activity - Nursery

Pom Pom Pick-Up is a fun and engaging activity designed to enhance fine motor skills and hand-eye coordination in nursery children. Using simple materials like pom poms and two sticks, this activity encourages children to practice picking up objects and transferring them from one place to another, fostering their dexterity and concentration.

It develops their fine motor skills. Manipulating the sticks to pick up the pom poms helps strengthen the muscles in the fingers and hands, enhances hand-eye coordination and encourages concentration. The activity requires precise hand movements to successfully pick up and transfer the pom poms: Children must focus on the task at hand to successfully complete the activity, building their concentration and attention skills.



Fun with Drinking Water - Pre-primary

The objective of this activity is to teach kindergarten students about the importance of drinking water for their health and well-being.

Engaging young learners in activities that promote healthy habits is essential for their overall well-being.

Teaching kindergarten students about the importance of staying hydrated and drinking water can lay the foundation for lifelong healthy habits.

Exploring Creativity with Blow Painting Nursery

For encouraging creativity in young children, we at Ryan Education School conducted the Blow painting activity. It is essential for their cognitive and emotional development.

Blow painting is a fun and engaging activity that not only stimulates creativity but also enhances fine motor skills and hand-eye coordination. This simple yet exciting activity is perfect for nursery-aged children to explore colours and textures in a playful environment.

Shapes Circle - PP-I

It helps children to identify the differences between different shapes while they learn to identify the features of each shape. It also builds their vocabulary. Teaching children to identify geometric shapes is important as we are surrounded by various shapes and encounter them in daily life. One such shape is a circle.

A circle is a very easy and simple shape to learn, identify and draw. In fact, when kids start holding a pencil or a crayon, they try to make circle patterns automatically. Teaching with the help of games or activities will keep the children engaged and entertained. Make your child recognize the circle shape whenever possible and with the help of

everyday examples, like a round chapati or a ball.

Ensure to give your child enough space and time to learn and show interest in learning about this shape. Motivate your child to keep up the learning pace by rewarding them for the correct answer.

Red Color Sorting Activity - Nursery

The red color sorting activity involves providing children with a water basket filled with various colored pom poms, with the objective of sorting and picking only the red ones. The red color sorting activity is a versatile and enjoyable way to facilitate learning through play.

This activity not only teaches colour recognition but also cultivates essential skills that lay the foundation for future learning.

Pom Pom Apple Tree Nursery

To develop fine motor skills, hand-eye coordination, counting, and color recognition.

We at Ryan school conduct one activity, We just show the picture of an apple tree. We explained that they move one pom pom at a time and place it on a branch of the apple tree.

They use their fingers to place pom poms on a particular place or a circle.

"Pom Pom Apple Tree" activity is a fun and engaging way for nursery students. They enjoyed it a lot.

Table Manners Activity Pre-primary

RESJ offers quality education with strong emphasis on holistic learning and life skills development. Students are provided with a conducive learning environment that fosters teamwork, collaboration, and communication abilities in children and prepares them to acquire the potential to face the world outside.

Here students are taught good table manners from their early years, they are given the opportunity to create the right social interaction etiquettes that are likely to help them throughout their lives.

Good table manners demonstrate respect for others at the table. This respect extends to valuing everyone's meal time, conversation, and effort. While doing the activity students were taught the basic points like: Wash your hands before eating, Put your napkin in your lap at the beginning of the meal, and don't forget to use it. Pull in your chair, sit up straight, don't make noise while chewing, don't talk while eating and keep your elbows (and feet!) off the table.

All the children enthusiastically took part and enjoyed the activity.

We encourage our learners to pick up one blue pom pom at a time with the help of a peg and place it into the corresponding sorting container.

By combining colour recognition with physical movement, this activity promotes holistic development and fosters a love for learning through play.

Craft Activity Starry Crumble - Pre-primary

Art and craft activities help children develop their fine motor skills by requiring them to use small muscles in their hands and fingers. This is important for early childhood motor skill development, alongside hand-eye coordination, as these skills are necessary for tasks such as writing, eating and taking care of themselves.

It boosts cognitive skills, improves self-expression & self-esteem.

Star of the Week

Star of the week is an initiative to make every child feel special and celebrate his uniqueness. Every week, a student is designated as "Star of the Week". The student's parents visit the class and interact with other students of the class. They share information and anecdotes about their child and hear about their child from his classmates. Parent Teacher Meeting

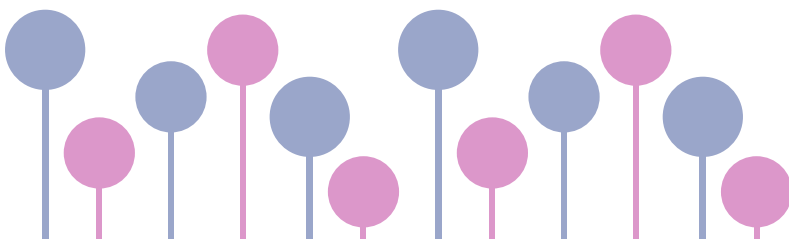
“Together we may give our children the roots to grow and the wings to fly.”

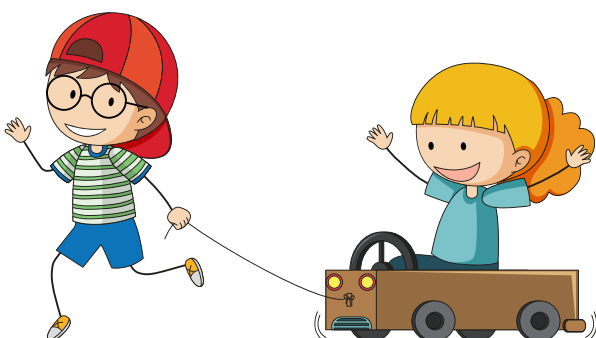
