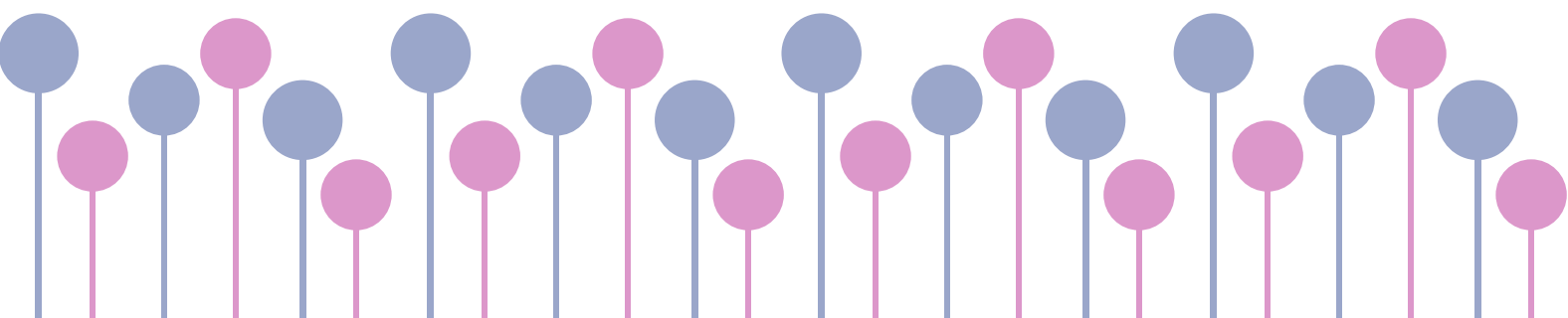

Fun With Shapes Activity - PP II

In this engaging activity, the teacher draws various shapes (circle, square, triangle, rectangle) on the floor. Students were then called one by one to participate, with the teacher announcing the student's name and the shape they need to jump into. The student excitedly jumps into the corresponding shape, practicing shape recognition and identification while having fun. This interactive activity proved to be both informative and enjoyable, as students eagerly participated and developed their knowledge of basic shapes.



Hand Wash Activity

Children are vulnerable to infection and hygiene plays a vital role when it comes to good health.

On 2nd July 2024, a Hand Washing Activity was held for the pre-primary students of RES Jaipur. The aim of the activity was to make the children aware that washing hands properly helps in preventing spread of infection. The children were advised that they must practice hand wash at key times such as after using the toilet or before eating food. The hand washing instructions were given to them which each one of them observed and followed. It was an eye opening experience for the little ones.



Healthy Food Activity

To promote healthy eating habits in young children we need to raise awareness about the importance of a balanced and nutritious diet. The key objective of this activity was to

help them to reduce the consumption of processed foods which are high in unhealthy fats and sugary beverages. These items often lack essential nutrients and contribute to the risk of various health issues. Children were shown the healthy alternatives to help them make healthier food choices. Also, the negative impact of eating junk food was discussed.

Color Sorting Activity Nursery

The objective of this activity is to help Nursery students recognize and sort blue and red balls through a fun and interactive game that includes singing.

To begin with children were gathered in a circle to play the sort game.

There were two baskets, one blue and the other red.

Teacher Started by singing "Fire on the Mountain" with the children, encouraging them to sing along and clap their hands. While singing, bounced a ball in the air to keep their attention and excitement high. Instructed the children to pick up the balls and place them in the correct baskets. The teacher clapped for the participation, and also praised them for doing a great job.

Story of Letter 'B' - Nursery

To engage and educate our Nursery students with a captivating story that enhances their listening skills, imagination, and understanding of basic concepts, and this time our little champs were learning

Sense Organs

Experiential learning involving sense organs and body parts is a powerful educational approach that engages students directly through sensory experiences.

By directly interacting with stimuli and observing physiological responses, learners develop a deeper understanding of human anatomy and sensory perception.

Experiential learning activity of sense organs allowed pre-primary students to engage their senses, develop scientific skills, and gain a deeper understanding of the sense organs and their functions. By making learning fun and interactive, we encourage curiosity, creativity, and a love for exploration!

Match the Numbers - Nursery

To help students recognize numbers and match them with corresponding quantities a fun activity was conducted for the nursery students. Students placed the counters on the number that matches the quantity of objects shown. They then say the number aloud as they place the counter.

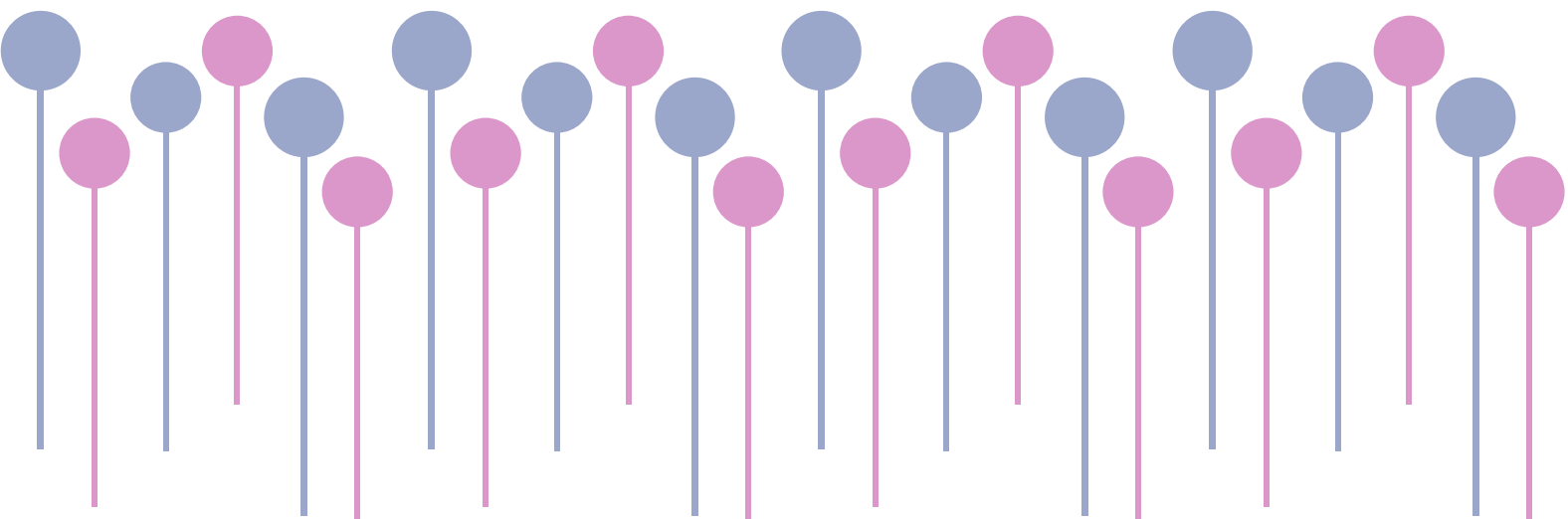
Fancy Dress Competition
