Sight Words Prep II

Sight words are high-frequency words that are recognized and read automatically, without sounding out or decoding. These words are essential for fluent and efficient reading, as they appear frequently in everyday texts.

In this activity, the teacher divided the class into 4 groups and then Flash cards of sight words were displayed on the table. After that the teacher called out the sight word.

Students searched and picked up the corresponding flash card of sight words. Students read the sight word aloud.

This activity develops essential reading skills, boosts confidence.

National Symbol Identification - Prep II

For an engaging lesson, prep II students delved into India's rich cultural heritage by exploring national symbols.
