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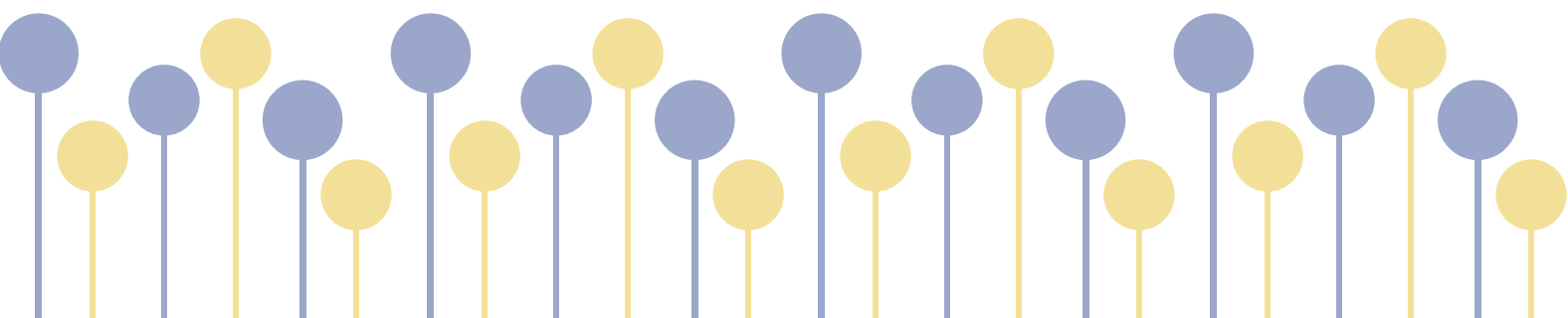

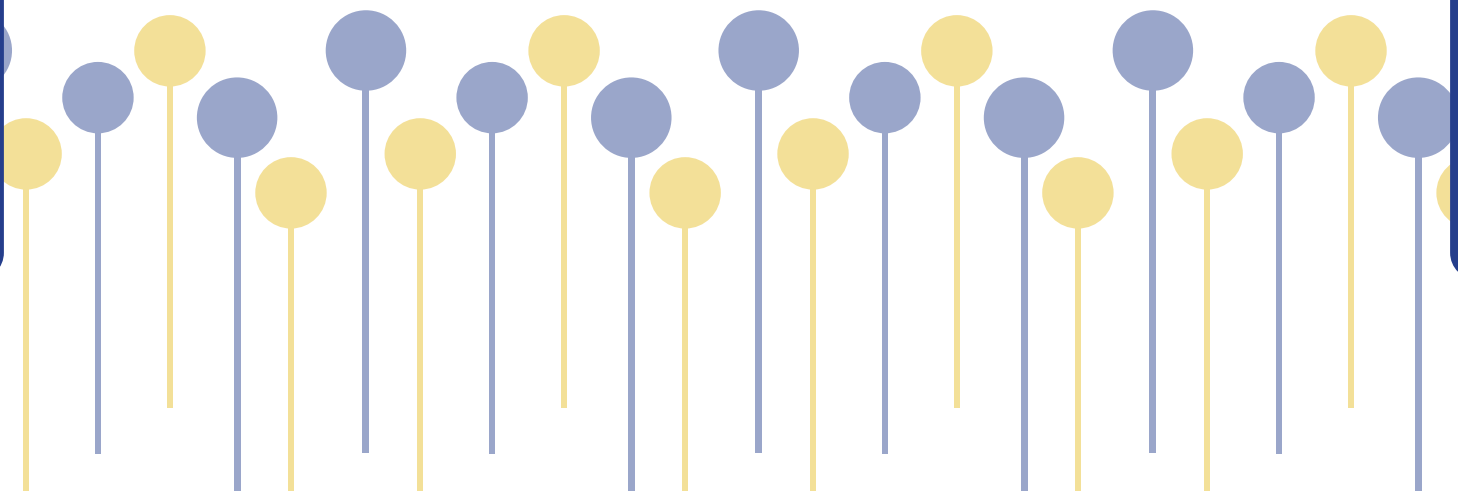
Benefits Of Healthy Lifestyle

ACTIVITIES

My Engine - Prep I

Students of grade prep I creatively crafted their own engine models using paper cutouts, unleashing their imagination and fine motor skills. With colorful papers, young learners assembled engine components, such as wheels, chimneys, and cabins. This engaging activity developed essential skills in problem-solving, spatial awareness, and hand-eye coordination while introducing basic transportation concepts.



Colourful Faces - Nursery

Play with Numbers Nursery

In this interactive activity, the teacher shows flashcards displaying numbers in a random order. Students must observe each flashcard, identify the number, and then locate and circle the corresponding number on their number grid. This approach not only reinforces number recognition but also enhances students' attention to detail, observation skills, and familiarity with numbers. The activity can be extended by varying the number range or encouraging students to find numbers in different patterns on the grid, making it adaptable for different learning levels and engaging for young learners.

Positions - Prep I

Students of grade prep I enhanced their spatial awareness through an interactive 'Position Exploration' activity. Using everyday objects, they learned and demonstrated their understanding of basic positional concepts such as 'on,' 'under,' 'behind,' 'in front of,' and 'in between.' This engaging activity fostered their problem-solving abilities while expanding their vocabulary.

Children's Day Activity Prep I

On Children's Day, our prep I students had a blast participating in a lively game of musical chairs! The activity was filled with
