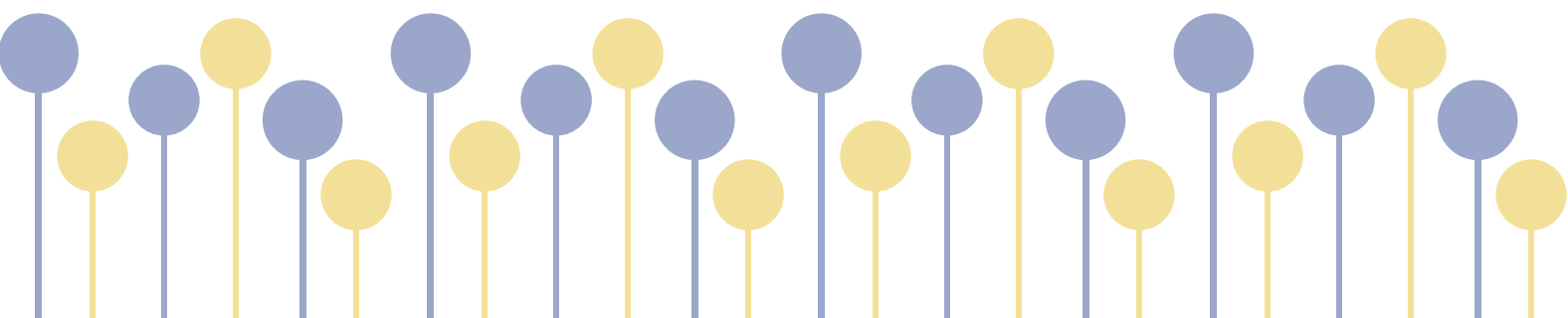

Teachers play a vital role in shaping the minds and characters of teenagers during a crucial phase of their lives. Here are some key aspects of a teacher's role:

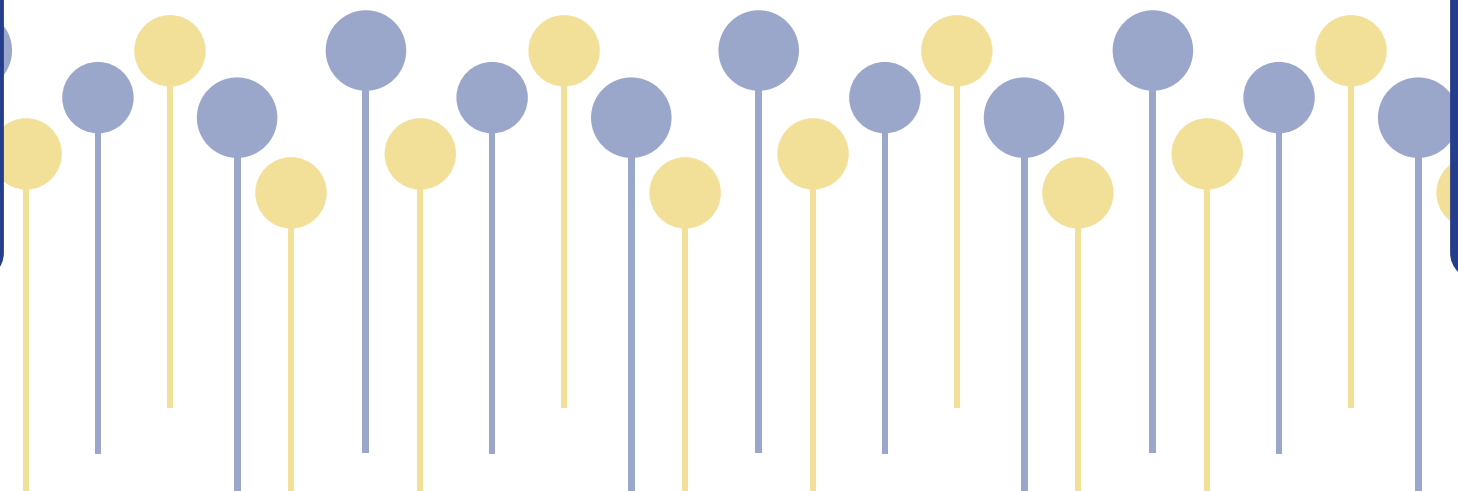

ACTIVITIES

First Day of the School

The first day of school was filled with excitement as our young learners engaged in a fun and interactive activity designed to foster teamwork and coordination. Two tables were arranged with a small gap between them, over which a chart paper with a large hole was placed. With eager smiles and lively enthusiasm, the children worked together to pass a ball through the hole, practicing aim, control, and cooperation.

This playful setup not only helped develop their motor skills but also encouraged communication, patience, and group participation. Laughter and cheers echoed through the classroom as the children immersed themselves in the task, celebrating each small success together.

It was a heartwarming and energetic beginning to their learning journey—one that set the tone for a year filled with exploration, growth, and joyful discovery.

One-Hand Paper-Cramping Activity - Nursery

To support the development of fine motor skills and hand strength in our young learners, we organized a fun and interactive activity called One-Hand Paper Crumpling. In this activity, children were encouraged to crumple sheets of paper using only one hand.

Though simple, this activity is highly effective in strengthening the small muscles of the hand, enhancing finger dexterity, and improving grip control—all foundational

skills for everyday tasks and future writing. The children thoroughly enjoyed the tactile experience of squeezing and shaping the paper, participating with great enthusiasm and concentration.

By using one hand at a time, they were able to isolate and strengthen each hand individually, which aids in building better hand coordination and control. It was a joyful, hands-on experience that seamlessly combined play with purposeful skill-building.

Mera Sathi - Prep II

In this interactive activity, students enhanced their Hindi literacy skills by matching व्यंजन (consonants) with their corresponding pictures. व्यंजन cards were arranged on one table, while related images were placed on another. With enthusiasm and focus, the children successfully paired each consonant with its matching picture, reinforcing letter recognition and vocabulary through a fun and engaging hands-on experience.

Find My Junior - Prep II

Students participated in an engaging and educational activity where they matched capital letters with their corresponding lowercase forms. Through this hands-on experience, they carefully observed the similarities and differences in the formation of each letter pair, deepening their understanding of the alphabet.

This activity not only reinforced letter recognition but also helped build visual discrimination skills, an essential foundation for reading and writing. As they matched each pair, students became more confident in identifying letters

in both forms, improving their literacy and preparing them for independent reading tasks.

Figure Out Position Activity Prep II

Students took part in an interactive activity designed to reinforce their understanding of the prepositions in, on, and under. Using a box and a given object, they demonstrated each preposition by accurately placing the object in the correct position.

Through this hands-on exercise, students applied their thinking skills to identify spatial relationships, strengthening both their vocabulary and comprehension. The activity not only enhanced their understanding of prepositions but also supported the development of spatial awareness and cognitive skills in a fun and engaging way.

Dhundo to Jane Activity Prep II

Students enthusiastically took part in a hands-on activity that involved identifying and categorizing स्वर (vowels) and व्यंजन (consonants) into designated boxes. This thoughtfully designed exercise not only reinforced their understanding of Hindi alphabets but also fostered the development of fine motor skills through active manipulation of the learning materials.

As they sorted each letter with focus and precision, students exercised their critical thinking and analytical abilities, engaging their minds while having fun. The activity effectively promoted cognitive growth,

creativity, and problem-solving, making the learning process both dynamic and deeply enriching. It was a wonderful example of how interactive methods can transform foundational language concepts into an enjoyable and impactful learning experience.

Vowel Voyage Activity Prep II

Students enthusiastically participated in an interactive activity where they identified and selected vowel letter cards from a set displayed on a table. By applying brainstorming and critical thinking, they were able to distinguish vowels from other letters with confidence. This engaging exercise not only strengthened their phonetic awareness but also supported the development of cognitive skills such as attention to detail and analytical thinking. The hands-on approach made learning both enjoyable and meaningful, turning a fundamental language concept into a fun-filled educational experience.

Dining Decorum Pre-primary

As part of the Poshan Pakhwada initiative under the CBSE program, our pre-primary students enthusiastically took part in the Dining Decorum activity, aimed at encouraging healthy eating habits and cultivating proper table manners. Through this thoughtfully designed experience, the children learned essential dining etiquette—setting the table with mats, sitting correctly, wearing aprons, and washing their hands before and after meals. They also practiced chewing with their mouths closed and using utensils like forks and spoons with care and confidence.
