Comparing numbers is one such activity which is important to build number sense in the learners where students can determine more and fewer, greater than, less than and equal to, and putting a group of numbers in order.

For this, one activity was conducted in Grade I where Students learn the number value, by comparing numbers.

Students were given flashcards of a few numbers, and were asked to tell who is having the biggest number and who is having the smallest number.

Students enjoyed it, and learned the concept easily.

### MEASUREMENT - MATHS CLUB ACTIVITY

KNOWING WHAT AFFECTS BMI AND HOW TO CALCULATE it is an important tool for helping students understand their own health. Maths club activity from Grade I to V was conducted to let students explore and calculate BMI. In the first session of maths club students learnt about how to measure their weight on a weighing scale.














# **CELEBRATIONS**
