# ACTIVITIES

## NUMBER FUN – GRADE PPII

Children need opportunities to learn and experience numbers. Learning to count, identify numbers, and recognition of numbers are a few of the essential concepts.

A strong number sense is vital for future understanding of more complex math topics.

So keeping this thing in mind we took an activity of number fun, and our learners enjoyed this activity and identified the given number and fixed it up in sand.

## PASTE A BINDI ON A CIRCLE – NURSERY

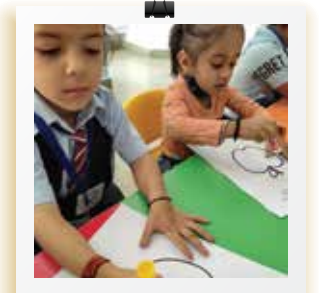
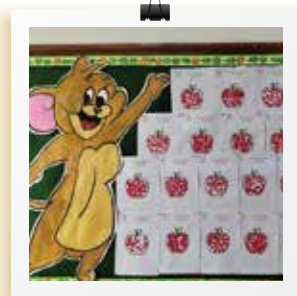
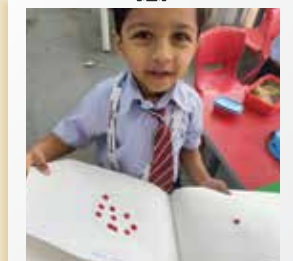
Children love to learn through activity. So, to introduce circle and red colour ● identification to our little learners, a fun and well engaged activity was conducted where kids had to paste a red colour Bindi on a circle.

It was a very fun learning activity, and the little ones enjoyed this activity thoroughly while learning the red colour concept and circle which enhanced their concentration span and also improved their motor skills.

## TEAR AND PASTE – NURSERY

Recognizing the colours and identifying the colour names is an important part of a child's development. Early identification of colour helps to create the cognitive link between visual clues and words.

So, one wonderful activity was conducted for our little learners to introduce the Red Colour. The best part of this activity was that students did the work on their own.





## CATCH THE STICKS – NURSERY

Simple brain-boosting exercises can be helpful for our little learners to stay sharp and smarter. These activities are good for eye-hand coordination. These activities (for the age group of 2.5 to 3 years old children) keep them engaged and entertained at the same time. We can see that children learn faster through play and practice.



## LET'S READ THE SIGHT WORD – GRADE PREP II

Sight words demonstrate basic knowledge one-to-one letter sound correspondence concepts.

As a child begins to read, the first thing they will need to learn is sight words.

In this activity, the learner read the word on the stick and said the word while underlining it with her finger and showed it to everyone.



## LET'S MAKE A GROUP – GRADE PREP I

Brain boosting activities with hand and eye coordination are very helpful for our little learners to stay sharp and smart.

One activity was conducted for the same and all children engaged themselves and entertained at the same time. Children learn faster through play, practice and in groups.







## MAKE SHAPES WITH DOUGH – GRADE PREP I

Playdough is a wonderful sensory and learning experience for children.

When the child shapes the playdough into a ball, a square or rectangle they're thinking creatively. The squeezing, pinching, and pulling movements also strengthen the child's hand muscles and develop fine motor skills.

Play dough activity conducted in Grade PPI where learners enjoyed making shapes with dough.

They were fully engaged in this activity and very happy while doing this. Students made different shapes like ball, squares and rectangle.

## EQUAL SETS WITH DIFFERENT OBJECTS – GRADE PREP I

As children develop their sense of numbers in kindergarten, one of the concepts that sometimes needs reinforcement is comparing sets to find more, less, and equal amounts. So, for this, one activity was planned for the children of Grade PP-I where they had to make equal sets of different objects. Children were excited while doing the activity. This activity helped the learners to develop their thinking and creativity skills.





## COLOR SORTING ACTIVITY – NURSERY

Sorting colours helps and builds visual perception, thinking skills and important brain skills that help with memory, attention, and problem-solving. These sorting skills are very important to build a strong foundation for the children to perform better at school. Children can generally sort into colours before they can identify the name of the colours.

One activity was conducted for the nursery students to make them aware about sorting the colours and colour sense by sorting red colour balls.

This was the recapitulation of red colour, and the learners know the colour, so they were excited and enthusiastic to sort this in the class.
