Welcome back children..... you brought life and energy to our campus.

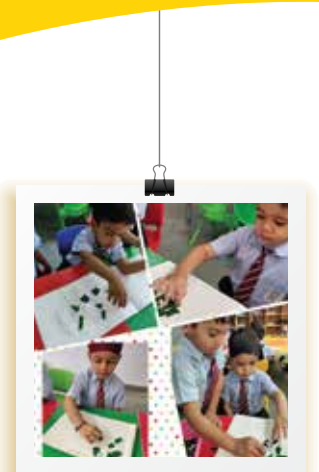

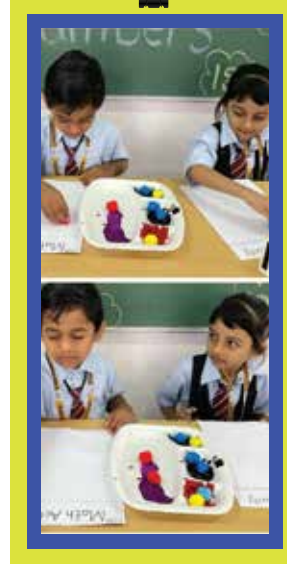
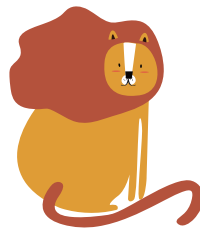
All this was done to make their first day a special and unforgettable one after summer break.
