FIELD TRIP TO SCIENCE PARK – GRADE V

A field trip of grade V was organised by Ryan Education School to Science Park on 14th July 2022, to make the learning of science a joy while simultaneously imparting knowledge to develop their zeal towards experimentation, innovation and invention in a self-expressive manner at a young age.



The Science Park was filled with fun and information through various indoor and outdoor exhibits and demonstrations and other training activities.



The student visited the first gallery Frontiers of Astronomy where they studied about cosmos and intriguing questions related to astronomy. The Biomedical Revolution was the second gallery where students saw various exhibits which comprised the complete history of medicine and immunization interactively. The Fun Science gallery gave the students hands-on experience with exhibits which were highly engaging and entertaining for the students. The 3D theatre was another feature to make learning entertaining where students watched various images with their 3D glasses. The most awaited was the Dino park where students encountered realistic figures of different types of dinosaurs and learnt about them in detail.



The planetarium presented astronomy concepts to the students uniquely and interactively. The Science Demonstration Corner conducted live demonstrations and experiments for the students which made them curious and excited about science. The "Children Corner" section offered an interactive and activity-based learning environment through simple experiments with a variety of puzzles and science kits.



The trip was exciting and created awareness among the students on important topical issues in science as well as providing an effective environment for non-formal science. It made complex science principles easy to understand and reduced the fear and hesitation in students.

TAEKWONDO CLASS GRADE III 'A' AND III 'B'

Taekwondo is a Korean form of martial arts characterized by punching and kicking techniques, with emphasis on head-height kicks, spinning jump kicks, and fast kicking techniques. They are a kind of martial arts in which one attacks or defends with hands and feet anytime or anywhere, with occasional use of weapons. The physical training undertaken in Taekwondo is purposeful and fosters strength of mind through mental armament. The young learners of grade III learnt a few martial art techniques. They all were very excited about it. All the students participated in this activity with full zeal and enthusiasm. They also learnt the importance of physical strength.



TAEKWONDO CLASS – GRADE IV

Taekwondo develops a child's athletic abilities and self-awareness, and improves the child's capabilities in self-defence. Taekwondo emphasizes on moral development as well. Children learn self-respect, self-discipline and self-restraint. The students of grade IV learnt a few martial art techniques. They all were very excited about it. All the students participated in this activity with full zeal and enthusiasm, they were focused and followed instructions by their coach thoroughly.



INNOVATION LAB ACTIVITY – MAGNET CAR – GRADE III AND IV

The main aim of this activity is to make a magnet car to develop the knowledge of magnet and its uses among students along with the understanding of general scientific concepts like working of a magnet, shapes of magnet and attraction and repulsion. Students enjoyed a lot while doing this activity.



MOTOR BOAT – GRADE V

The main aim of this activity is to make a motor boat to develop the basic hand skills among students along with the understanding of general scientific concepts like working of a motor boat, sail boat, and balloon boat. Grade V children understood the concept behind three different types of boats and the science of floating and sinking of any object.

CATAPULT – GRADE VI

The main aim of this activity is to make a catapult to develop the knowledge of how a simple machine can be used to do work and its uses among students along with the understanding of general scientific concepts like lever type of machine, simple machine and parabola movement. Grade VI children enjoyed the activity and understood the concept of catapult very well.



STATIC CRANE MODEL – GRADE VII

The main objective behind this activity is to make students understand the concept of crane and to develop the knowledge of how crane can be used for lifting heavy objects and its uses among students along with the understanding of general scientific concepts. Students enjoyed this activity a lot.



CONE MOVING UP – GRADE VIII

The main aim of this activity is to develop the knowledge of how a cone can move upwards on an inclined plane and its uses among students along with the understanding of general scientific concepts like centre of mass. Explained to students how gravity works but cone can move upwards and oppose gravity.

Star of the week is an initiative to make every child feel special and celebrate his uniqueness. Every week, a student is designated as "Star of the Week". The student's parents visit the class and interact with other students of the class. They share information and anecdotes about their child and hear about their child from his classmates.
